

SPOTLIGHT JOLANTA KUBACKA

The Edison Housing Authority would like to shine the spotlight on Director of Housing Jolanta Kubacka, C-PHM. Here at EHA, she oversaw Robert E. Holmes Gardens (REH) as public housing manager for two years and then fulfilled the same role at Julius Engel Gardens (JEG) for 15 years. In 2022 she transitioned to public housing manager, and shortly thereafter director of property management, at Julius Engel Gardens (JEG). We recognized her outstanding performance which earned her a promotion to director of housing. In her new role, Jolanta has been overseeing both Robert E. Holmes Gardens and Julius Engel Gardens, answering residents' questions, filing work orders and recertifications, organizing inspections, reviewing rent adjustments, and assisting with community events including the food pantries at Julius Engel Gardens.

Originally from Poland, Jolanta came to the United States in 1985 and worked at Clara Barton Apartments for 10 years before joining our team here at the Edison Housing Authority. She is a certified public housing manager and in her spare time she enjoys cooking and reading as well as crocheting and knitting items like sweaters and purses; she's currently learning Tunisian crocheting!

Jolanta likes getting to know our residents and being able to help and direct them to programs that fulfill their lives, "I really like talking to people, being there for them, being able to help them with problems and issues. They know that if they have any issues they can come and talk to me. I emphasize an open door policy where residents are welcome to come and ask me any questions because I am more than happy to assist."

She also works closely with Patricia Tamburello who leads the Bridges program. Bridges is offered to EHA residents 62 years and older and is funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development/Residents Opportunity for

Self-Sufficiency (HUD-ROSS). This program "bridges" individuals with disabilities to supports and services that are available in the town and county, "Connecting Today to Tomorrow." Jolanta also partners with other organizations to help improve residents' quality of life by working one-on-one with residents to develop plans to address issues in a supportive manner.

Rental Assistance & The Anchor Property Tax Relief Program



We want to ensure our residents have financial stability during this difficult time. In 2022, we assisted residents in applying to the new Affordable New Jersey Communities for Homeowners and Renters (ANCHOR) Property Tax Relief Program for the 2019 tax year and we did so again in 2023 for the 2020 tax year.

New Jersey tenants 64 or younger are eligible to receive up to \$450. New for this year, those 65 or older are eligible to receive up to \$700. Those who applied for the 2019 tax year may not have had to file another application for the 2020 tax year if no information changed. Applications were due December 29, 2023 and individuals can review the status of their application at www.state.nj.us/treasury/taxation/anchor.


