B1. PLAN ELEMENTS: RESPONSE TO ANNUAL PLAN:

Due to the RAD conversion at Robert E. Holms Gardens a significant Amendment was made to the 5 year plan which was conducted within the five years. (Attached is the significant plan)

The Significant Plan addresses the following: Notice to families, details that include families will not be relocated off the property, RAD notice, etc.

B2. NEW ACTIVITIES: RESPONE TO ANNUAL PLAN:

Both RAD Phase I and II conversions will not require demolition. It will be strictly a redevelopment project that will provide major upgrades. The RAD conversion of Phase I Robert Holmes Gardens units will be turned into Public Based Voucher units. Based on our assessment of the property, it was determined that one of the five bedroom units will be converted into (2) bedroom units. Thus, increasing our affordable housing unit count from 90 units to 92 units.

Residents will not need to relocate off the premises, as we plan to move residents to a completely renovated building, and then renovate their building, etc. We will be requesting HUD to approve removing units from PIC for construction Modernization that has an approved CHAP. In addition, EHA received an Emergency Safety and Security Grant to improve the safety conditions at both Robert Holmes Gardens and Julius Engel Gardens. We will be installing additional security cameras and doors that have fob entry.
